**Objections to Transfer of Premises Licence** 

### **Summary:**

Cumbria Constabulary have issued an objection notice under the Licensing Act 2003 for the application received by Mr Benjamin Read, to Transfer the Premises Licence for Truth (Nightclub), at the above address in Carlisle.

The notice provides details of the reasons why the Police have objected and options for Members to consider in light of the representation from the Police.

### Recommendations:

It is recommended that the Sub Committee determine the matter and either:

- a. Dismiss the Police objection for the Transfer of Licence and grant the application.
- b. Allow the Police objection to the Transfer of Licence and reject the application as made.

The Applicant Mr Read was a Director of 'Truth Enterprizes' (aka Truth Entertprizes) - in whose name, the Premises Licence was revoked at a Licensing Sub Committee held on 17<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024. The Police will propose that to allow the application will simply re-create the situation which led to the Review of the Licence.

### 1. Background

- 1.1 Truth Enterprizes Ltd Unit 7 Englishgate Plaza, Botchergate, Carlisle has a Premises Licence **Appendix 1** which authorises opening between 10am and 5am Sunday to Friday. The Licence permits a range of Licensable activities including:
- a) Sale of Alcohol Sunday Saturday 10am and 4:30am
- 1.2 In October 2023 The Police requested a Review of the Licence due to ongoing issues which undermined the Licensing Objectives.
  - 1.3 As a Company Truth Enterprizes was struck off/dissolved by Company's House on 16<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024. A new company, B&2 Ltd applied to Transfer PL437 into their name on 12<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024. The application requested that the Transfer have immediate effect and it was processed that day. **Appendix 2.**
- 1.4Searches of Company's House records show that B&2 Ltd has two directors listed Mr Ben Read and Mr David Thompson. These are the same Directors listed as for Truth Enterprizes the lapsed company. Appendix 3 & 3A.
- 1.5 On 17<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024 Licensing Sub Committee at Carlisle Revoked PL437 after a Review Hearing.

The reasons stated are:

- 1. The Sub Committee has had regard to the provisions of the Licensing Act, the National Guidance and the Local Licensing Policy and the Licensing Objectives, in particular the prevention of crime and disorder, the Public Safety and the protection of Children from Harm which has led to the decision to revoke the Licence for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 2. The Committee has considered other options available to them and they do not consider the removal of the DPS and the proposed new conditions would rectify the problems that are occurring.
- 3. Having considered the evidence before them, that being, but not limited to a meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2023 with the DPS and the manager of the premises, Letter dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2023 addressed to the DPS and Licence Holder, letter dated 12<sup>th</sup> July 2023 addressed to the DPS and Licence holder, shows that other responsible authorities have tried to engage with the management but to no avail or improvement. In line with the guidance, the Local Authority should not merely repeat previous efforts and a warning is inappropriate.

- 4. Having considered the CCTV transcripts and evidence given by the manager of the premises at today's hearing, it is clear that there has been a complete lack of knowledge or awareness of the licensing objectives and the importance of these when running a licensed premises. It is the licence holder's responsibility to employ staff that adhere to, and promote, the licensing objectives on their behalf.
- 5. The overriding remaining issue is the management's complete disregard of the licensing objectives, which have continued throughout this process. The Committee consider that the issues are a direct result of poor company practice and policy and solely removing the DPS is an inadequate response to the problems raised by the various representatives.
- 6. In order to promote the licensing objectives, in particular the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm, the Committee feel the only option for them is to revoke the licence.
- 1.6 On 9<sup>th</sup> Feb 24, Director,Mr Read submitted an Application to Transfer the Licence into his own name. **Appendix 4.** (The application was submitted by Kurnia Licensing Consultants acting on behalf of Mr Reed, on the evening of Friday 9<sup>th</sup> Feb 24 and was received and processed the following Monday 12<sup>th</sup> Feb 24). This is the matter in hand. The application was accompanied by information that B&2 Ltd was no longer an entity (but did not amount to a formal withdrawal of their application for Transfer).
- 1.7 Where insolvency has occurred a Transfer Application preserves the Licence for 28 days.
  - Following a Revocation the Premises can remain open pending an appeal to Magistrates. Such an appeal has been lodged by Kurnia on behalf of Mr Read, with North and West Cumbria Magistrates Court a hearing date has been fixed 7<sup>th</sup> Mar 24.
- 1.8 On 16<sup>th</sup> Feb 24 a Licensing Subcommittee at Carlisle Supported the Police Objection to Transfer of Licence to B&2 Ltd. The reasons for this decision are attached at **Appendix 5**.
- 1.9 Where an application for Transfer of Premises Licence (relating to alcohol sales) is received a copy of the application is provided to the Chief Officer of Police for that area.
- 1.10 If the Chief Officer of Police is satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances of the case where the granting of the application would undermine the Licensing Objective

- 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' - the Police must give the relevant Licensing Authority a notice within 14 days of their being notified that they intend to object.

### 2. Notice of Objection

- 2.1 In this case, such a notice for the application has been received by the Licensing Authority on 16<sup>th</sup> Feb 24 from Police Licensing Officer acting on behalf of Cumbria Constabulary. **Appendix 6**
- 2.2 The Police provided information within their Notice of the reasons why it is thought that the granting of the application would seriously undermine the prevention of crime and disorder objective the basis being that the application is simply a 're-branding' of the lapsed management concern whose failure to address the issues listed has resulted in the recent revocation. I will attach the minutes of the Licensing Sub Committee hearing on 17<sup>th</sup> Jan 24. **Appendix 7.**

### 3. Legal Position

- 3.1 The Licensing Authority (in this case, Cumberland Council) is required to hold a hearing to consider the objection. The Police served Notice of Objection within the fourteen day period. A Hearing must be held unless the Authority, the applicant, Benjamin Read, and the Chief Officer of Police who gave the Notices agree that a Hearing is unnecessary. The Hearing must be held in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 3.2 In accordance with Regulation 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations, 2005, the Authority may consider documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice either before the Hearing or, with the consent of all parties at the Hearing.
- 3.3 The Panel may accept Hearsay evidence and it will be a matter for the Panel to attach what weight to it that they consider appropriate. Hearsay evidence is evidence of something that a witness neither saw nor heard themselves but has heard or read about.
- 3.4 It must be noted that clear reasons should be given for the decisions and an appeal may be made to the Magistrates Court against the decisions of the Authority by the Responsible Authority (in this case the Police), interested party or premises licence holder within 21 days from the date of being notified.

3.5 Section 52(11) of the Act provides that a determination under this Section does not have effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

### 4. Reasons for Decision/Recommendation

- 4.1 The Licensing Authority has received objection notice from Cumbria Constabulary in relation to applications to transfer the Premises Licence PL437. They have said that granting the application would seriously undermine the crime prevention objective.
- 4.2 The application will be determined in accordance with the relevant sections of the Act, the statement of Licensing Policy and guidance offered by the Secretary of State.

### 5 Recommendation

It is recommended that the Sub-Committee determine the matter and either:

### For the Transfer of Premises Licence Application:

- a) Dismiss the objection for the application to Transfer the Premises Licence and grant the application.
- b) Allow the objection to the Transfer of the Premises Licence and reject the application as made.



#### ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Mandatory conditions are subject to amendment by central government. It is the licence holder's responsibility to ensure that they are up to date with any changes in legislation.

### Mandatory conditions where licence authorises the supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### Mandatory condition where Door Supervisors are provided

(Except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos)

- (1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must:
  - a) Be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Act 2001 (PSIA); or
  - b) Be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Licensing Act 2003
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed:
  - (a) In respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the PSIA 2001(premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
  - (b) In respect of premises in relation to:
    - (i) Any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by the club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising films or under a gaming licence, or
    - (ii) Any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act)
- (3) For the purposes of this section:
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purpose of that Act,
  - (b) Paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

### The following conditions shall apply from 28th May 2014

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979.
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

 $P = D + (D \times V)$ 

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the

date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### The following conditions shall apply from 1st October 2014

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carryout, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable Page 14

manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
    - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

#### ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

### The prevention of crime and disorder

- A tamperproof CCTV system will be installed at the premises to the satisfaction of Cumbria Constabulary.
- All Recording will be kept and maintained for 31 days
- · All Managers and Supervisors will be trained in the downloading of recordings from the CCTV system
- All staff will assist the police in any enquiries carried out by them at the premises
- Notices will be clearly displayed stating it is unlawful to buy or sell alcohol to persons under 18

### Public safety

- · A fire risk assessment will be completed to the satisfaction of Cumbria Fire Service.
- All fire fighting equipment will be maintained in good working order.
- All fire exits will be kept clear from obstructions at all times.
- All spillages and breakages within the premises will be immediately cleaned and signed by staff.

### The prevention of public nuisance

- When regulated entertainment takes place all doors and windows will be kept closed to reduce noise levels.
- No noise nuisance will be caused to neighbouring properties.

This matter concerned Cumbria Constabulary making an objection to an application to transfer a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for Truth (PL437).

The Sub-Committee has considered the application and has taken into account the evidence before it today.

In particular they heard from the Council's Licensing officer and a representative of the police. There was no representative from the Premises Licence Holder B&2 Ltd.

After careful consideration, the Sub-Committee has unanimously decided to uphold the objection made by the police and refuse the transfer of the Premises Licence. The Sub-Committee gives the following reasons for this decision

- The Sub-Committee has had regard to the provisions of the Licensing Act, the National Guidance and the Local Licensing Policy and the Licensing objectives in particular the prevention of crime and disorder. This has led them to the decision to refuse the transfer of the Licence for the promotion of licensing objective, the prevention of Crime and Disorder.
- 2. Having regard to the local licensing policy paragraph 12 states "the Council must exercise its function having regard to the likely effect on crime and disorder in its area and must do all it can to prevent crime and disorder." "The Council will look to the Police for the main source of advice on these matters" given the evidence provided by the police they have a clear concern about the running of the premises by the same individuals, under a different company name. In order for the Council to promote the prevention of Crime and Disorder the transfer is refused.
- 3. In relation to national guidance paragraph 9.4 "there is no requirement for a responsible authority or other person to produce a recorded history or problems at premises to support their representations." There is evidence provided by the police "Truth Enterprises were found to have failed to comply with the premises licence conditions and as a result the premises were not ran in accordance with the expectations and standards of a Licence" "Cumbria Police have no reason to believe that the premises will be managed in a responsible manner that upholds the licensing objectives." The Committee supports that position of the police and refuses the transfer of the license.

On the 6<sup>th</sup> October 2023 Police submitted a review of the premises licence for Truth Bar due to ongoing issues the police had identified since the bar opened in 2022 under the management of Truth Enterprises Ltd and the licence holder undermining three of the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime & disorder, public safety and also the protection of children from harm. A copy of the application will be available to view at any hearing.

On the 17th January 2024 the review of the premises licence was held and the Committee supported Cumbria Police's application and resolved to revoke the premises licence. The formal minutes of that meeting will be available in due course.

Records from Company House show that Truth Enterprises Ltd was dissolved on 16th January 2024.

On the 16th February 2024 the review of the transfer of the premises licence from Truth Enterprises Limited to B&2 Limited was held and the committee supported Cumbria Police's application and refused the transfer of the premises licence. The formal minutes of that meeting will be available in due course.
